Purpose:	To provide guidance to staff and residents on the matter.		
<p><b>Policy Statement:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The Town may provide a water shut-off valve (also known as a “curbcock or curbstop”) to be located on or near the property line.</li> <li>2. The provision of such shut-offs may also be deemed to be a cost of development and an expense of the developer.</li> <li>3. If the shut-off valve is damaged due to vehicles driving over it, or by other avoidable acts, the Town shall not be responsible for repair or replacement. Repairs must be done to the satisfaction of the Town.</li> <li>4. If a curbstop is encased in cement, the resultant cement work needed to repair it shall not be a Town responsibility.</li> <li>5. As of January 23, 2017, the Development Officer shall advise development applicants to refrain from placing the water curbstop in the driveway.</li> <li>6. The Town may replace curbstops when they become non-functional, show signs of leakage, or for any other reasons the Town deems appropriate.</li> </ol>
