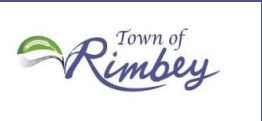

BY-LAW NO. 31

A BY-LAW OF THE TOWN OF RIMBEY AUTHORIZING A CENTENNIAL PROJECT

WHEREAS it is proposed that the Centennial Project for the Town of Rimbey, will be a Historical Park, Museum and District Archives; and

WHEREAS the estimated cost of the Centennial Project is Twenty thousand Dollars, (\$20,000.00) and

WHEREAS ~~IT IS~~ IS proposed to apply for a joint federal-provincial centennial grant of \$ 11,684.00; and

WHEREAS it is proposed to enter into an agreement with the County of Ponoka # 3 whereby the said County will undertake to waive \$ 8,688.00 of the federal-provincial centennial grant available to it and to join with the Town of Rimbey in its application for a centennial grant ; and

WHEREAS the Town of Rimbey will provide the amount of \$ 5842.00 out of the current revenues for 1965-1966 and 1967;

NOW THEREFORE, under authority of the Town and Village Act, being Chapter 57 of The ~~Statutes~~ Revised Statutes, the Council of the Town of Rimbey, duly assembled, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. that this Council does approve of the proposal for the Centennial Project as outlined above;
2. that the Town shall make application to the proper authorities for the joint federal-provincial grant in the amount of \$ 11,684.00;
3. that upon receiving confirmation of the approval of the Project by the Government of Alberta and the Government of Canada, the Town of Rimbey Council are authorized to enter into such contracts on behalf of the Town as may be necessary for the Centennial Project;
4. that the Title to the property on which the said Project will be located will be acquired by the Town of Rimbey and shall not thereafter be sold or otherwise disposed of;
5. that the Town shall continuously maintain the said project at all times;
6. that this By-Law shall come into force and effect on the final reading thereof.





WHEREAS the total taxes levied or caused to be levied by The Village of Rimhey for the current year for ordinary village purposes, including the amount required to meet the requisition of any hospital district, is the sum of twenty hundred twenty and 25/100 Dollars (\$ 2020.25 ):

AND WHEREAS the Council of the said village deems it necessary to borrow for and to expend the sum of five hundred Dollars (\$ 500.00 ) in carrying out such purposes until such time as the taxes levied therefor can be collected:

Borrowings must not exceed 60% of levy.

Take notes under the seal of the Village attested by the signatures of its Mayor and Sec.-Treas.

2. That such borrowing be done by promissory note or notes under the seal of the said Village attested by the signatures of the Mayor and Secretary-Treasurer thereof.

3. That the Council of the said Village do hereby pledge to the said Bank as security for the payment of the money to be borrowed hereunder, the whole of the unpaid taxes and penalties on taxes assessed or levied by the said Village in prior years, together with penalties thereon, and the whole of the taxes for the current year, and the said Village shall deposit in a special account with the said Bank all of the said taxes and penalties as collected, as collateral security for the payment of the money to be borrowed hereunder, and interest thereon, but the said Bank shall not be restricted to the said taxes and penalties for the payment of the money to be borrowed hereunder, nor shall it be bound to wait for payment of such money until such taxes and penalties can be collected, or be required to see that they are deposited as aforesaid.

4. Nothing herein contained shall waive, prejudicially affect or exclude any right, power, benefit or security by statute, common law or otherwise given to or implied in favour of the said Bank.





A BY-LAW PROVIDING FOR THE BORROWING OF FUNDS

WHEREAS the Council of the Town of Rimbey find it necessary to borrow funds during the year 1965;

WHEREAS it is deemed advisable to borrow from the Rimbey Bank of Montreal;

NOW THEREFORE Council duly assembled, authorized the Mayor and Secretary-Treasurer to sign and complete documents for the borrowing of funds in 1965 not to exceed Forty-Thousand Dollars, (\$40,000.00).

READ a first, second and third time and finally passed this 11th day of January, A.D. 1965.

BY-LAW NO. 37  
TOWN of RIMBEY

A BY-LAW PROVIDING FOR THE ABATEMENT OF NUISANCES.

WHEREAS, basements or other excavations left unfilled after the removal of a building, are deemed by the Council to be dangerous to the public safety, welfare and health;

WHEREAS excavations such as an old sewer disposal hole are left properly unprotected whilst a building is situated partly over this sewer disposal hole; is deemed by the Council to be dangerous to the public safety, welfare and health;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Town of RimbeY, under the authority and subject to the provisions of Section 321 of The Town and Village Act, Chapter 338, R.S.A., 1955, hereby enacts that:::

WHEN, in the Town of RimbeY, any building is removed from its site and such removal leaves exposed a basement or excavation, such exposed basement or excavation is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

Any person, being the owner, or the person entitled to the possession of the property upon which such nuisance is created, shall within 15 days from the date of the removal of the building cause the excavation to be filled in or otherwise abated.

Failure to abate any such nuisance within the specified time shall constitute a violation of this by-law and shall render the person responsible, liable, upon summary conviction thereof, by a magistrate or other person of competent jurisdiction, to a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00) and costs, and in default thereof to imprisonment with or without hard labor in the nearest common goal for any period not exceeding sixty days (60) unless such fine and costs, including the costs of committal, are sooner paid.

PROVIDING also, if the building is not removed but the existing sewer disposal hole or any type of excavation is deemed unsafe, and dangerous to the public welfare and health, the Council of the Town of RimbeY shall give notice in writing to the owner, or the person entitled to the possession of the property upon which such hole is created, giving 7 days notice from the date of the notice to cause the hole or excavation to be properly filled in to the satisfaction of the Council.

If the owner fails, neglects or refuses to remedy the nuisance of the hole or any existing hazard to the public safety, welfare and health., the Council may cause such work to be done as the Council deems necessary to remedy it and may charge the cost of the work done to remedy the condition- to the owner and in default of payment may;;

- (1) recover the same as a debt due to the Town of RimbeY; or
- (2) charge the same against the land concerned as taxes due and owing in respect of that land and recover the same as such.

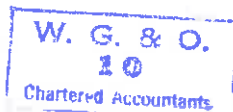
